Resurrection Stories



Hymn Fest at New England

On Sunday, April 14, at 4 p.m. the New England Congregational Church along with the Fox Valley American Guild of Organists will present a free and open to the public Hymn Festival in the sanctuary of the New England Congregational Church, 406 West Galena Blvd., Aurora. Leading the congregation with each organist accompanying one hymn will be eight organists who are members of the Fox Valley AGO chapter. They are: Adam Gruber, Oak Park; Nicholas Hansen, Sycamore; Daniel Schroeder, Batavia; Marianne Kim, Oak Brook; Barbara Masters, Elmhurst; Andrew Maya, Aurora; Karl Bruhn, Lombard; and Jeff Neufeld, Elgin. Preceding each hymn will be a short, informative narrative given by Dr. Jane Holstein, former keyboard editor of Hope Publishing Co.

A special organ solo, "Wachet auf" by J.S. Bach will be played by 13 year old Anthony Adduci, student of Daniel Pollack.

As well as the organ, congregational hymn singing will be accompanied by the Stonegate Brass Ensemble directed by Paul Semanic. Paul Laprade will conduct the brass/organ segments. Marsha Foxgrover, New England organist, and Dr. Steven Wente of Concordia University are the Co-Chairs for the event. There will be a gala reception provided by NECC following the Hymn Festival.


