PASTOR'S COLUMN

Greetings Members and Friends of Wesley United Methodist Church,

We had some unseasonably warm weather in the month of February that included some severe storms in our area. As Hannah, Haylee, and I sheltered in our basement waiting out the storm, I received text messages from friends across the area checking in to see if we were ok. It's a pretty amazing feeling to have a community of people who checks in on you and makes sure you are ok! Who do you call to check in on when storms roll through the area? Who calls to check on you? Who are the people in our community who might not have anyone checking on them? These are the questions that were running through my head as I laid safely in my bed after the storms had passed through our area.

As followers of Jesus, we have a rich tradition and history of being people who care for those in the community who others would ignore. However, as was discussed in the Gospel of Mark group, the sentiment in the wider community is not as favorable as it once was for the people called Christians. Part of that has to do with the ways that particular groups of Christians have excluded people and caused harm, but I think another part has to do with the fact that we are not fully living into being followers of Christ. Followers of Christ must remember and follow the "Greatest Commandment" as taught by Jesus in Matthew 22:36-40.

"Teacher, what is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: You must love your neighbor as you love yourself. All the Law and the Prophets depend on these two commands."

As we continue our Lenten journey, I hope that we will all do some self-reflection and think about how we are living as Followers of Christ and what changes we might make in our lives to better reflect the life and lessons of Jesus.

The journey of self-reflection and correcting our actions to live more in line with Christ does not stop at Easter. The Easter Season is a time of celebrating all the ways in which resurrection is possible in our lives. We can be in need of rising out of the depth of imprisonment, addiction, poverty, illness, and oppression — not just physically and literally, but also spiritually. What keeps us locked up inside? What holds us back from the joy of life? What binds us, keeping us from the fullness of who God created us to be? Join us in worship starting April 7th for powerful testimonies of courage, kindness, strength, and overcoming — Resurrection Stories — from those who have found "resurrection" in their lives. It might just inspire you to unlock your own rising up!

WESLEY FINANCIAL UPDATE 2024

Recently, several of us from Wesley attended a leadership workshop in Barrington, where Bishop Schwerin talked about the changes going on in the greater United Methodist Church. It is definitely a time of great change in the life of our denomination structurally and financially and possibly doctrinally. For more details see the other article about the Workshop in this newsletter. A brief summary is that the United Methodist Church is facing a 40 to 45% budget reduction and the number of Bishops will drop to 32, 27, or 22 this year (54 before Covid). Our Bishop will now be overseeing Northern Illinois and the Wisconsin Conferences, serving as 1 Bishop for those 2 large areas. The Conferences and local churches are also affected by the ongoing adaptions to a post-Covid life with loss of membership and income.

Our church, Wesley UMC in Aurora, Illinois and many churches in the Northern IL Conference are not immune to these changes either. Our building (25,000 sq. ft) is aging and the maintenance expenses are increasing. We have also lost people and income due to Covid and the death of several big givers.

\$474,907 TOTAL 2023 EXPENSES

\$47,461 maintenance and repairs (Total 2020-2022 expenses were \$100,000) We also want to thank our trustees, Wally Loague and Jim Merk, who donate a tremendous amount of maintenance work every week to help keep our building running.

\$37,781 utilities

\$27,324 insurance premiums

\$36,503 administrative costs which are postage, internet, supplies, IT, computer software, kitchen supplies, office equipment, etc.

\$15,844 Ministry, Outreach and programming.

\$10,800 Apportionments

\$299,104 Salary/taxes (Our biggest expense is our dedicated staff, a full-time Pastor, 3 part-time ministry and office personnel plus a custodian and an on-call mechanical engineer. We don't want to forget our dedicated unpaid support staff, Meredith Lindgren, Carol Stoffel, Jim Merk.)

\$493,209 TOTAL 2023 INCOME (Including withdrawals from our endowment fund most months to cover

expenses) \$277,920 Pledged and Non-Pledged giving \$12,875 Cost Sharing Income \$8,805 Apportionment and Misc. Offerings \$193,609 Endowment & Fundraising Monies

As the chairperson of the Governing Board, I would like to report we have been working for a long time now to find a way to bridge the gap that is developing in our budget. We have a wonderful, dedicated staff and we don't want to have to cut staff, but that is a possibility.

We sought out cost sharing partners to use our building. During Covid we lost our major partners, People for Childcare and the Fox Valley Special Rec. Our income from these sources has dropped from \$20,000 to \$12,000. We are always seeking and reaching out for new partners and we hope to bring that income back up to \$20,000 or more this year.

At one point in 2023 **we had hoped to renovate and convert our big kitchen into a Ghost Kitchen** for food trucks. The City of Aurora's ordinances specify their food must be prepared in a licensed facility before being sold out of their trucks. There is a large need for these kitchens, but to meet the necessary renovations, health, and safety requirements of the city, the renovation estimate cost came back as \$270,000. That is still a future possibility, but we will have to seek out and apply for grant money and donations. Are you someone who could help with this?

WESLEY FINANCIAL UPDATE 2024 (continued)

This January we convened a Fundraising Task Force, consisting of Kathy Breazeale, Pastor Tammy, Kelly McCleary, Genevieve Akyea, Lore Baker and James Clarke, to brainstorm other avenues of revenue. You will be hearing more about this, but so far we have scheduled 2 crafts shows–April 6th & September 21st (sponsored by the Girl Scouts) and a 5 B's BBQ on Tuesday, April 16th. (*see next page*)

I am asking all friends and family of Wesley to keep their **eyes and ears open for new possibilities of fundraising** and report these ideas to Pastor Tammy or members of the Task Force. As you go about your daily activities of life, work, school, lunch with friends, retirement, if you hear of **an organization or individuals who are looking for space for meetings or a small business space, or family birthday parties, bridal showers, etc., ask them to call the office at Wesley.** Pricing is determined by day, space, and times needed. Rooms are available on all 4 floors. We ask for donations/cost sharing fees.

We will need everyone, the Governing Board, the Staff, the congregation, working and definitely praying together to accomplish balancing our budget. We pray that with God's help we will not become that statistic that shows Wesley, having had a rich congregational life of 170 years, has had to drastically downsize, or even close. Thank you.

Report from NIC Leadership Training in Barrington, Jan. 27, 2024

Notes taken by Kathy Breazeale at Bishop Schwerin's Address

Kathy Breazeale, Bob McKnight, Herb John and Pastor Tammy Scott attended from Wesley UMC.

- The church needs to understand the importance and have understanding of AI (Artificial Intelligence). We need to learn as it will impact us. It is seen as the new literacy.
- The UMC will be having massive budget cuts 40 to 45%. 20 years ago, there were 55 bishops in the U.S. By the end of 2024 that could be 32, 27 or even 22.
- At the end of 2019, 32% of churches in the Northern IL Conference had 35 members or less, by the end of 2022 51% of the churches had 35 or less.
- The bishops will need to make the new system work. They will be setting new goals. Who needs a full-time appointment? Looking at church sizes, who pays apportionments, pension obligations, water bills? Probably considering longer term appointments. 71% of pastoral appointment in place now have been for 3 years.
- NIC and Wisconsin will share 1 bishop. Other conferences will be consolidating. This will be creating a new system of management with different support staffing (who actually know the local churches and pastors), as 1 bishop can't be available to the hundreds of miles of territory and churches involved in collaboration on a daily or even a weekly basis.
- The bishop expects regionalization will come into play. The UMC will become less U.S.-centric. (Ex. Africa will handle its own issues, Europe handles its own, etc.) UMC will not be so dependent on the General Conference. Bishop Schwerin feels it will be hard, but the hurtful anti-gay language in the Discipline will probably be removed at General Conference this year.
- Immigration and migration and the needed hospitality for all these people (estimated to be 65 million on the move in next few years) will be a struggle. More multicultural leadership will be needed. Mission will be from everywhere to everywhere, but remember, Jesus is with the church.
- Acknowledge the world is changing, what we are doing is changing, we cannot prop up what was. If we don't focus on changing, we will be left behind or non-existent. What used to work, isn't, and that can create chaos. We must experiment and learn from failures. A new structure is emerging...
- Bishop Schwerin's Advice...Stay with the UMC stay, pray and help.
