Greetings Members and Friends of Wesley United Methodist Church,

The war in Ukraine has continued, there have been more mass shootings in our country, fighting has escalated in the Middle East, families seeking asylum have been sleeping in tents, police stations, and shelters as they await services, wildfires ravaged Hawaii, and so much more. In the coming weeks we will be exploring What Can Wait in worship. I think that what we will find is that much of what takes up our time and energy can wait, but some things can't wait: Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love!

Speaking of Peace...on November 8th, I signed onto the following letter that was sent to our interfaith brothers and sisters to stand in solidarity with them as the fighting in the Middle East has shown an increase of threats and violence against our Jewish and Islamic siblings.

#### Dear Neighbors.

In this time of global unrest and heightened tension between people of diverse faiths, we want you to know that we stand in solidarity with you, our neighbors. Now, more than ever, it is imperative that we join hands and hearts across the chasms that divide members of our common human family. Together, we bear witness to the power of authentic spiritual community and the transforming power of love.

We categorically reject all forms of religiously-motivated harassment, discrimination, and violence. And we join you in praying for and working toward a peaceful community that is truly welcoming of diverse religious expressions.

We are grateful for your witness and for your ministry to the physical and spiritual needs of our wider community. We affirm the value of your religious and spiritual tradition. We firmly believe that our community is enriched by the diversity of religious and spiritual beliefs to be found here.

## ADVENT SEASON

**Advent to Epiphany at Wesley UMC** 

This year, Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday! Officially, the church calendar would say that Christmas Eve does double duty as the Fourth Sunday of Advent. But we want Christmas Eve to be its own special celebration. So we are beginning Advent one week earlier! Advent literally means "arrival" or "beginning," and the season is traditionally understood to be a season of waiting and expectation. This year we'll be asking the question: What CAN'T Wait? as we travel together through the season.

### **Four Sundays of Advent:**

On each of these four Sundays we'll gather at our regular worship times.

November 26. The theme of the day is **HOPE**.

December 3. The theme of the day is **PEACE**.

December 10. The theme of the day is **JOY**.

December 17. The theme of the day is **LOVE**.

Christmas Eve is Sunday December 24

On Christmas Eve, we'll enjoy regular morning worship-with lots of carols! with two additional gathering times for afternoon / evening celebrations of the day.

9:30 am: Online service will be "published" and will be available all day.

10:30 am: Christmas Eve morning worship in the Sanctuary

**4 pm:** Cookies and Carols in the Parlor

Nativity Tableau: We'll provide costumes for anyone who wants to participate!

No need to memorize anything, we'll have a narrator!

**5 pm:** Christmas Eve worship in the Sanctuary.

This will be a traditional service with lots of carols and of course the singing of "Silent Night" by candlelight.

### New Year's Eve is Sunday December 31

On this important day, we'll use John Wesley's Covenant Prayer to shape our time together. This prayer informed Wesley's theology and preaching, and he expected the people called "Methodists" to pray it together at the beginning of each new year as a way of remembering and renewing their baptismal covenant and their own commitments.

9:30 am: Online service

10:30 am: Worship in Gathering Place.

Our Celebration of Epiphany is Sunday January 7.

Officially, Epiphany lands on the 6th. The twelve days of Christmas conclude on the 5th, with celebrations called "Twelfth Night" for Epiphany Eve. Congregations celebrate Epiphany on the Sunday closest to that day. The symbol of the day is the star, since on it we remember the journey of the sages and the signs in the sky that led them to Jesus. We'll be invited into reflection as we look forward, and we'll receive a "star word" to be a guide for us in the coming year. We'll also share communion.

Longest Night Observance: Light Up The Night 5:30 pm On this, the longest night of the year, we gather with local agencies committed to care and mutual aid for a time of vigil to remember individuals who have passed in the last year, but whose names may not have been spoken in public. With candles, a few short readings, and a recitation of names, we honor their lives and remember that everyone is sacred and worthy. We'll share more details closer to the day, but we gather downtown, and participating groups have included Hesed House, AID, Mutual Ground, Interfaith Food Pantry, Simply Destiny, Pride, Indivisible Aurora, and Every Town for Gun Safety.

So far we have received commitments of \$20,451 toward the new lift. We are more than 50% of the way toward our goal of \$40,000. Thanks to all who have already sent in money or commitments.


