Pastor's Column

Surrounded by a Great Cloud of Witnesses

If you have not attended worship during the month of January, you are certainly missing out. For the Season of Epiphany, we have invited seven lay persons from Wesley UMC to give the message each week. Each has presented a value that is important to them, told stories of how they adopted the value and how they are using it in their daily living. They've also presented us with ideas for rituals to use as a community to support the value.

I've heard from some of you about how this series has stirred your imagination and prompted you to consider a value that is important to you and a closer examination of the rituals you participate in. The genesis of this series came out of my observation that the rituals we practice have often become rote or obligatory without fully understanding the values that historically have supported them. In addition, while we can often be critical of the behavior and actions of others, we spend less time focused on the values that do or could inform our individual actions. This is one of the hallmarks of being United Methodist — our emphasis on the reciprocal nature of beliefs influencing actions and actions influencing beliefs.

Many of you have commented on how useful the presentations have been, a reminder that one does not have to be a talented, educated or charismatic preacher to develop a meaningful and memorable message to God's people. One only needs the conviction of their faith and values and a personal story to share.

Our speakers in February will be Jonathan Akyea, Katrina Baugh and Lynnette Singh. On the pages that follow, I've listed out the speakers in January, their values and rituals along with the blessing they received. As a church, we have adopted the practice of blessing each other in worship. The ancient practice of blessing is a deeply spiritual practice and one each of us can adopt in the wide circles of friendships we inhabit.
