

Pastor's Column

Traditions and rituals lose their importance when the values that are associated with them are lost. New rituals are created as communities adapt to new values and principles. I like this definition of ritual: "an act or series of acts regularly repeated in a set precise manner." Values reflect our priorities and beliefs and serve as a filter for our behavior.

Pastors who are new to a faith community are keenly made aware of a congregation's traditions and rituals. However, it often takes time to understand the underlying values that support them. Conversations about values quickly can turn into conversations about specific people and the importance of historic figures in the church who are associated with a ritual. People often say, we do it this way or that way because it's the way this person used to do it. It's much more challenging but also more meaningful to uncover the value associated with the beginning and ongoing practice of a ritual.

I'm increasingly aware of how important it is to talk about our individual values and beliefs. Theology, which literally translates into God logic, is best understood when we practice talking about it to others. It is in the discussions we have with each other about theology that we better understand and integrate beliefs and values into our daily practices.

There are three opportunities coming up for us to reflect on our values and beliefs. The first is more internally focused. Instead of having Laity Sunday, we are having Laity Season during the time of Epiphany. The scriptures during this season often reflect Jesus' words, "Come and see." It is an invitation to journey and discover. We have invited seven people from the congregation to talk about a value they have and how this value might be expressed in a ritual. I am beyond thrilled that seven of you are willing to embrace the assignment!

In conjunction with this project, workshops will be offered in January to help all of us work on this assignment of exploring an important value we have. I hope you will attend one or more of the workshops being offered. They are listed here in the newsletter.

Finally, we are looking for people to be recorded for a project we are developing to promote Wesley United Methodist Church in the community. We are looking for individuals who are willing to talk on camera about an aspect of community they find useful at Wesley UMC. Again, this is a values conversation. Sean will be seeking out individuals to help with this project. Please be on the lookout and sign up!

January is a good time to evaluate our values and beliefs and to consider rituals and practices to best support them. I look forward to working on this for myself and together with you as a faith community. May God bless our efforts to live more intentionally in our collective future.
