Pastor's Column

I recently walked into my neighborhood grocery store, Prisco's Family Market. Prisco's is a staple in our family. Whether it's to purchase from their vast selection of cheeses, yummy gelato or assortment of cannolis, we frequently walk there from our house. A couple of weeks ago, I was making another walk down to Prisco's and thought to myself, "Come July, I'm not going to be able to walk here anymore!" I started to cry. In Prisco's, standing next to the cannolis. I was telling a friend about this experience, and they said, "You should probably pay attention to that. To your sadness." They're right. Transitions are not easy. We need to pay special attention to them. We can acknowledge the challenge and also recognize that we will survive and probably thrive from the experience. Good things often come out of transitions.

It's hard to leave after ten years. I have enjoyed the relationships I've developed both at Wesley United Methodist Church and in the community. With the new structure that was implemented in 2015, I went from four monthly administrative meetings to one! My colleagues are still super jealous. I've worked with a lot of gifted staff over these 10 years but this is the best configuration of staff I've ever worked with. And as a community, we made a lot of great memories and did a lot of good, which I look forward to celebrating on June 3^{rd.} Hope you can be there!

I also recognize that it's hard for a congregation to go through a change in pastoral leadership. Maybe it's for the same reasons. Maybe it's because we follow an appointment process, which on the one hand guarantees that the congregation will always have a pastor while also providing pastors the freedom of the pulpit to preach what needs to be preached. On the other hand, the process does not give the congregation nor the incoming pastor a lot of input or self-determination.

These ten years certainly have been shaped and formed by the partnership between us. Many of you have led and started new initiatives. Some of them were temporary. Others continue today. Your visions, dreams and discernment of God's calling for you makes us who we are today. Your efforts have made a difference and changed lives.

I, too, have had visions and dreams and discerned God's call in my life. It's also the case that over time, the church begins to function around the style of leadership of the pastor. Priorities and focus are influenced by the pastor. When people find out that a long tenured pastor is leaving, it can be scary because part of the congregation's identity is wrapped up in their pastoral leader.

It's also true that having a new pastor is exciting. The beginning of a new appointment brings with it all the potential and possibilities of spring. New leadership means new perspectives, new ideas, new ways of seeing the work of the beloved community. In much the same way you trusted and respected me, Pastor Tammy will have opportunities to explore and try out new ideas while maintaining and building on the work we have done together.

I've learned and grown a lot as your pastor. I think we all have. I'm not the same person I was ten years ago and that's Good News! I appreciate the ways we have managed transitions together with opportunities for failures and room for making mistakes. It's how we learn. God calls it grace. I hope you will afford Pastor Tammy the same space and opportunities that you gave me.

While I am sad to leave Wesley UMC (much more than I am about leaving Prisco's), I'm also excited about Pastor Tammy's leadership and the experience she will bring to this beloved community.


