Pastor's Column

Greetings Members and Friends of Wesley UMC,

This past month I have had the opportunity to meet more people from Wesley and I am continuing to get the feeling that Wesley is truly a family! I also met more people who share our building to serve the community. I have explored the city of Aurora a little bit, met with community members, tried a couple more restaurants (keep your suggestions coming!), and offered the invocation at the City Council Meeting on Tuesday, August 22nd.

At home we have done some schedule adjusting and are beginning to figure out our school year rhythm. Hannah & Haylee started 3rd grade at Southbury Elementary School in Oswego and cheered for their first Panthers football game at 8:30am on a Sunday and made it to church (still in their cheer uniforms!) I imagine many of them were shared person to person, family to family sitting around a table, campfire, or other common gathering place. So, let's hear some of those familiar and not-so familiar Old Testament stories as we begin our journey into God's Story. September through May we will hear God's Story told through the Narrative Lectionary (https://www.workingpreacher.org/narrative-faq). As we listen to God's Story unfold this year, it is my hope that we will also deepen our faith and our understanding of how we are a part of God's Story that continues to be written today!

The Bible stories we will hear include the major episodes in Scripture. They are arranged in a narrative sequence to help us see Scripture as a story that has coherence and a dynamic movement:

- From September to mid-December the preaching texts begin with the early chapters of Genesis, move through the stories of Israel's early history, the exodus, the kings, prophets, exile and return.
- From Christmas to Easter there is sustained reading of one of the four gospels
- From Easter to Pentecost the texts are chosen from Acts and Paul's letters.


